Sylvia Molloy is an Albert Schweitzer Professor of Humanities Emerita at New York University, where she taught Latin American and Comparative literatures and established the Creative Writing in Spanish Program. Her critical work includes *La Diffusion de la littérature hispano-américaine en France au XXe siècle*, *Las letras de Borges*, *At Face Value: Autobiographical Writing in Spanish America*, *Hispanisms and Homosexualities*, *Poéticas de la distancia*, and *Poses de fin de siglo*. She is also the author of two novels *En breve cárcel* and *El común olvido*, and three collections of short prose pieces, *Varia imaginación*, *Desarticulaciones* and *Vivir entre lenguas*. She has been a fellow of the Guggenheim Foundation, the National Endowment for the Humanities, the Social Science Research Council, and the Civitella Ranieri Foundation. She has served as President of the Modern Language Association of America and of the Instituto Internacional de Literatura Iberoamericana.
